Free BSO Neighborhood Concert at Jeremiah E. Burke High School on Saturday, November 19

Expanding on the BSO's mission to build personal connections to the local community, the BSO Neighborhood Concert at Dorchester's **Jeremiah E. Burke High School** (60 Washington St.) on Saturday, November 19, at 3 p.m. will feature a chamber orchestra made up of members of the Boston Symphony Orchestra, led by BSO Assistant Conductor **Earl Lee**. The hourlong program includes an eclectic selection of works by Beethoven, Carlos Simon, Walker, Shostakovich, Mozart, Bach, Jessie Montgomery, and Tchaikovsky. Please see below for a full program.

The programming was designed by the BSO's newly named Resident Fellows—violinist **Leonardo Vázquez Chacón** and bassist **Andres Vela**—in consultation with BSO Artistic Advisor for Education and Community Engagement **Thomas Wilkins**. Last month, the BSO announced the **Susan W. and Stephen D. Paine BSO Resident Fellowship Program**, a year-long training and mentorship opportunity for early-career musicians from historically underrepresented backgrounds in American orchestras. Chacón and Vela performed their first concert as inaugural BSO Resident Fellows on Thursday, September 22, with their fellowships extending throughout the BSO, Boston Pops, and Tanglewood seasons.

The concert is presented with support from **Bank of America** as part of their support of the BSO's ongoing partnership with the Boston Public Schools.

Details of the February 28 BSO Neighborhood Concert at UMass Lowell will be announced at a later date.

Free Community Chamber Concerts in Eight Massachusetts Communities, October 2-May 21

As part of the Boston Symphony's Education and Community programming this season, members of the Boston Symphony Orchestra will perform **12 free Community Chamber Concerts**.

This season's concerts take place in **Framingham** (2/26), **North Adams** (3/26), **Groton** (4/2), **Methuen** (4/23), and **Dorchester** (5/21). An additional five concerts (11/4, 2/24, 2/3, 3/3, & 4/28) will take place at Northeastern University's Fenway Center, just around the corner from Symphony Hall at 77 St. Stephen St. Please see below for a complete schedule. Boston Symphony Orchestra musicians began performing free Community Chamber Concerts in 1998 to provide engaging chamber music to Greater Boston area communities limited in access to the BSO by distance or economics. The goal of the Community Chamber Concerts is to build connections between the BSO and its communities in the Greater Boston area. All concert programs last approximately one hour.

Free Rolling Recitals by the Boston Pops Esplanade Brass Quintet

Created during the pandemic to continue providing live music in places where people work and live, Rolling Recitals is a series of 20-minute pop-up concerts featuring the Boston Pops Esplanade Brass Quintet who are transported via an **Old Town Trolley** to each destination to perform. On November 1, stops included Chittick Elementary School in Hyde Park, the Edelweiss Village Assisted Living Center in West Roxbury, and the West Roxbury VA Medical Center. And on October 25, Rolling Recitals made stops at Mattahunt Elementary School and Mildred Avenue K-8 School in Mattapan, and the Carney Hospital in Dorchester. More Rolling Recitals are planned in the spring.
